

# External Copyright Policy

## 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to (a) set forth the conditions under and process by which ULSE Inc. d/b/a UL Standards & Engagement (“ULSE”) as owner of standards-related Intellectual Property may decide to grant requests for permission to use and/or reproduce such Intellectual Property; and (b) confirm the position of ULSE with respect to certain other matters related to Intellectual Property and parties external to ULSE.

## 2. SCOPE

This policy covers all ULSE Intellectual Property as defined herein. Wherever there exists a license agreement under which ULSE has granted a license with respect to ULSE Intellectual Property, the terms of that license agreement govern the use, reproduction, distribution, or other copying of such documents, even if those terms conflict with this Policy.

## 3. DEFINITIONS

“Content” includes any portion of any ULSE Intellectual Property that an external user wishes to use, reproduce, distribute, create derivative works of, or otherwise copy.

“Copyright Permission” means the Content owner’s authorization granted to third parties for permitted usage of the owner’s Intellectual Property such as, sharing, copying, selling, publishing, distributing, etc.

“Generative Artificial Intelligence” (Generative AI) is defined as a type of artificial intelligence that can create new content based on a body of data (text, images, or other content) that the Generative AI has been trained on. Generative AI generally creates such content in response to and utilizing a human-supplied prompt. Artificial intelligence is defined as a software-based tool that requires no human input once active, improves by observing its environment (data or physical), and completes specific tasks.

“Intellectual Property” includes material covered by patents, trademarks, copyrights, trade secrets, and other confidential information.

“ULSE Intellectual Property” includes but is not limited to all UL standards documents and any other documents generated and maintained as part of a UL standard document’s life cycle (which includes but is not limited to standards, bulletins, meeting reports, proposals, revisions, editions, historical standards, etc.).

#### **4. RESPONSIBILITY**

ULSE expects any external user of ULSE Intellectual Property, including but not limited to industry stakeholders, customers, contractors, third-party standard developing organization, etc. to comply with ULSE's copyright policy as described within this document.

#### **5. POLICY STATEMENT FOR ULSE COPYRIGHTED CONTENT**

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ULSE's dedicated teams will review all copyright permission requests and provide a response. Each decision will be guided by and aligned with ULSE's overarching vision and mission, ensuring consistency with our organizational values and strategic goals.

## **6. POLICY STATEMENT FOR EXTERNAL ORGANIZATION'S COPYRIGHTED CONTENT**

Users shall respect ULSE's copyright and the copyright of other individuals and organizations.
